Dear Parent, Guardian, or Staff Member,

This notice is being posted to comply with the New Jersey School Integrated Pest Management Act. Notre Dame Regional School has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Policy and has implemented an IPM Plan to comply with this law. IMP is a holistic, preventive approach to managing pests that is explained further in the school's IPM Policy included with this notice.

All school in New Jersey are required to have an in Integrated Pest Management Coordinator (IMP Coordinator) to over see all activities related to IPM and pesticide use at the school.

The IPM Coordinator of Notre Dame Regional School is Dr. Mary Alimenti, 601 S. Central Ave. Landisville, 08326 at 856-697-3456.

The IPM Coordinator maintains the pesticide product label and the Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS), when one is available, of each pesticide product that may be used on the school property. The labels and MSDS are available for review by parents, guardian, and staff members for information and to discuss comments about IPM activities and pesticide use at the school.

As part of a school management plan, Notre Dame Regional School may use pesticides to control pests. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) register pesticides to determine that the use of a pesticide in accordance with instruction printed on the label does not pose any unreasonable risks to human health and the environment. Nevertheless, the EPA and the DEP cannot guarantee that registered pesticides do not pose any risk to human health, thus, unnecessary exposure to pesticides should be avoided. The EPA has issued the statement that where possible, persons who are potentially sensitive, such as pregnant women, infants and children, should avoid unnecessary pesticide exposure.

A copy of the school's IPM Plan is available in the office at each school for your examination.
